AFAEMME PARTICIPATES IN THE 15TH INTERNATIONAL LOGISTIC EXHIBITION

Within the International Logistics and Material Handling Exhibition (SIL) 2017 conference, the Association of Mediterranean Chambers of Commerce and Industry (ASCAME) hosted the 15th annual Mediterranean Transport & Logistics Summit (MedaLogistics). The two-day event was jointly organized with the Consorci of Barcelona and supported by the Barcelona Chamber of Commerce and Industry. Every year since 2003, the MedaLogistics Summit has convened experts, business representatives and high level policy figures from the sector in order to explore opportunities and address key priorities for the Mediterranean area. Over the course of its 14 years, the event has enjoyed an overall average participation of 9,100 participants and 13,200 respective business contacts. This year's agenda featured a number of innovative and timely themes within the transport and logistics sector, spread over the course of two days. In particular, the first day focused extensively on Logistics and Transportation, while the second explored economic trends within the Ports and Shipping sector.

AFAEMME's President, Maria Helena de Felipe, participated in a panel discussion on women entrepreneurs in the world of logistics and transport. In this context, Maria Helena de Felipe was responsible for moderating the roundtable entitled "Businesswomen of the Mediterranean in the areas of logistics and transport: Towards equal opportunities." The participants were Chelo Otero, Director of Comertial Portic; Luz Benítez, Country Manager of IContainers, and Anna Esteve, Founding Member of Wtransnet. The speakers shared with the audience their vision to create a culture of diversity and innovation in the transport sector. Similarly, they showed what is needed to make authorities, companies and the different actors recruit and retain more women in the sector. Finally, the speakers -as leaders of companies -- shared their successful strategies of supporting women and initiatives that have worked to achieve diversity and inclusion in the past.
